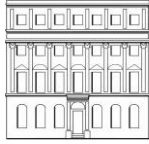

In cooperation with the German Historical Institute London, the German Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung will hold its first transnational workshop for postgraduate students in London on November, 10th and 11th, 2014.

This Call for Papers addresses UK-based MSc and PhD students in history and political science who work on German-British topics (20th and 21st centuries). We particularly welcome presentations with an explicit comparative or transnational approach. Together with a group of German PhD students working on similar subjects, participants will be given a chance to present and discuss their work. Two keynote lectures (by Prof. Andreas Gestrich, director of the German Historical Institute London, and by Prof. Kiran Klaus Patel, presently Gerda Henkel Visiting Professor in London and normally based at Maastricht University) will frame the event.
